A 100,000 HOMES Campaign

CHICAGO REGISTRY WEEK AUGUST 23-27, 2010

Common Ground's 100,000 Homes Campaign is a grassroots effort to find and place the most vulnerable, long-term homeless individuals into 100,000 households across the country by July 2013.

As part of **Common Ground's 100,000 Homes Campaign**, the Chicago Department of Family and Support Services in partnership with the Corporation for Supportive Housing, and the Chicago Alliance to End Homelessness are planning a weeklong effort to identify and help persons who are homeless obtain and sustain permanent housing.

The goal of **Chicago Registry Week** is to create a by-name registry of people living on our streets and in shelters, enabling us to prioritize those who have been out there the longest and who are the most vulnerable. What we learn together during this week will help us reduce chronic homelessness in Chicago.

The campaign is recruiting dedicated volunteers to canvass Chicago's streets and shelters to survey the city's most vulnerable homeless individuals and families. To ensure the most accurate count possible, we will survey individuals during the early morning hours for three consecutive days. The survey findings will be presented to the community at the conclusion of **Chicago's Registry Week** on August 27.
