Permanently housed

A family or individual is considered 'permanently housed' if their housing situation meets <u>all</u> the following criteria:

- There is no designated length of stay (i.e. it is meant to be long-term)
- They have a tenancy agreement that provides them protection under the Residential Tenancy Act

This <u>includes</u> individuals that have moved back to a family home (i.e. family reunification).

Permanent housing does not include:

 Transitional housing, which refers to supportive - yet temporary - type of accommodation that is meant to bridge the gap from homelessness to permanent housing.

Temporarily housed

A family or individual is considered 'temporarily housed' if their housing situation meets <u>any</u> of the following criteria:

- There is a designated length of stay
- It is meant to bridge the gap between homelessness to permanent housing
- They are not protected under the Residential Tenancy Act

Active: Homeless

Anyone that completes the VI-SPDAT will automatically fall into this category. This category should be checked if a family or individual previously fell into a different category and has returned to homelessness (e.g. a person completed the VI-SPDAT when they were homeless. They were then housed and updated as 'permanently housed.' They then lost their permanent housing and have *returned* to homelessness).

Active: Connected

This category should be selected if the individual is currently experiencing homelessness, but is connected to a **housing-specific program or worker** (e.g. Housing First). Please fill in the name of the program.

Inactive: No Contact

The Door Agency that administered the VI-SPDAT has not been able to contact the family or individual for 90 days, despite reasonable efforts.

Inactive: Transferred

The Door Agency that administered the VI-SPDAT has confirmed that the family or individual has moved to a community outside of Guelph-Wellington, with the intention of staying there for the foreseeable future.

Inactive: System

The Door Agency that administered the survey has confirmed that an individual is part of a system - e.g. jail, prison, treatment facility - for 90 days.

Inactive: Transitional

The family or individual is living in transitional housing, which refers to supportive - yet temporary - type of accommodation that is meant to bridge the gap from homelessness to permanent housing.
