Definitions relevant to the completion of this form:

- **Elevated Risk:** people are considered to be at elevated risk when they are involved in higher risk and/or exploitative situations. Some examples include sleeping outdoors and/or being at risk of victimization, abuse and/or violence. Elevated risk is indicated by the Higher Risk and/or Exploitative Situations domain of the SPDAT. *For more information, see the Prioritization Protocol.*
- **Exhaustive Market Rent Housing Search:** refers to a thorough search for market rent housing, either individually or with the support of a service provider, generally signified by an application made to at least 10 units in the private market. Proof of these applications may be requested where the household has completed the search themselves, though flexibility can be granted based on depth of need and circumstances. Where service providers are working with households, there is a sign-off option to indicate this occurred, as well as an exemption option where the capacity of the household will not allow for a market rent housing search.
- **High Acuity:** households are considered to be high acuity when they score in the following ranges
 - Adults - 10+ on VI-SPDAT for singles and 34+ on the Full SPDAT for singles
 - Youth - 10+ on TAY-SPDAT for youth and 34+ on the Full SPDAT for singles
 - Families - 9+ on VI-SPDAT for families and 54+ on the Full SPDAT for families
- **Medium Acuity:** households are considered to be medium acuity when they score in the following ranges
 - Adults – 4-9 on VI-SPDAT for singles and 20-33 on the Full SPDAT for singles
 - Youth – 4-9 on TAY-SPDAT for youth and 20-33 on the Full SPDAT for singles
 - Families – 4-8 on VI-SPDAT for families and 27-53 on the Full SPDAT for families
- **Trimorbidity:** people are considered to be trimorbid when they have co-occurring mental health, physical health and substance use concerns. Trimorbidity is indicated by the Mental Health, Physical Health and Substance use domains of the SPDAT. *For more information, see the Prioritization Protocol.*
